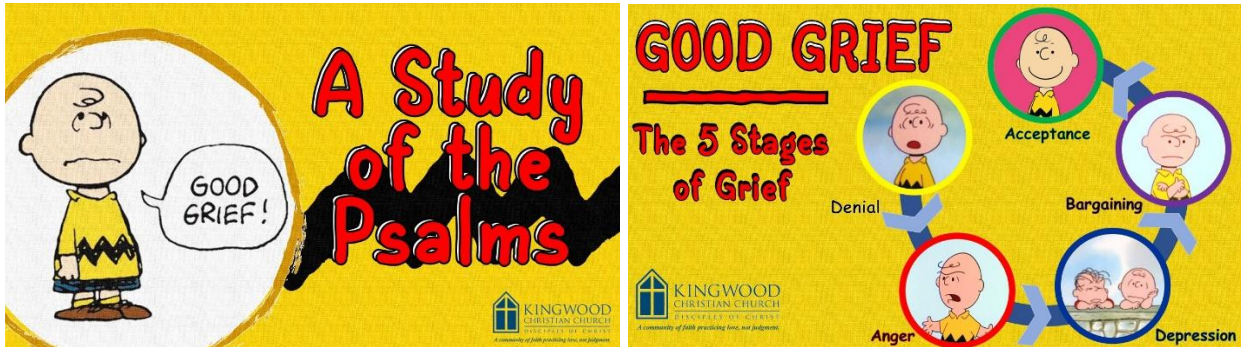


June 14, 2020 – Worship Guide
